York University Summer Studies 2016 Rome and Florence FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE **COURSES OFFERED IN ENGLISH**

The following university credit courses are offered for either seventeen or thirty-four days commencing in Rome (June 13 - June 28) and continuing in Florence (June 30 - July 15). Whether it is incorporated into a summer of travelling, or specifically focused on a program of study, this is a unique opportunity to experience the culture and civilization of Italy in a practical and enjoyable way. Students will reside in the center of Rome and Florence, so that the museums, art galleries and monuments of the two cities will be within walking distance or easily accessible by public transportation. A detailed itinerary of the program will be provided at a later date and orientation sessions will be held at York University prior to departure date.

Course Descriptions

AP/Italian 3771 3.0 Modern and Contemporary Italian Culture (Half course, taught in English, cross-listed to: AP/HUMA 3611 3.00)

COURSE DIRECTOR: John Picchione - Department of Languages, Literatures, and Linguistics, York University.

SCHEDULE: Rome, Monday to Friday, 9:00-12:00 am

Key issues of Italian culture, with focus on unification and national identity; Fascism and the Resistance; political parties and intellectuals; the role of the Church; the economy and the shifts in social values, youth revolts and feminism, visual arts, cinema, literature, and design.

Knowledge of Italian is not required. Students counting the course towards a major or a minor in Italian Studies may be required to complete coursework in Italian.

AP/Italian 3761 3.0 Italian Medieval and Renaissance Civilization (Half course, taught in English, cross-listed to: AP/HUMA 3610 3.00)

COURSE DIRECTOR: Roberta lannacito-Provenzano - Department of Languages, Literatures, and Linguistics, York University.

SCHEDULE: Florence, Monday to Friday, 9:00-12:00 am

The main aspects of the Italian Renaissance are studied. The focus will be on the Florentine contribution to the arts, literature and culture in the context of the social and political transformations taking place from the 14th to the 16th centuries.

Course tuition fees are payable to York University. Domestic tuition fees for the 2015-2016 Fall-Winter Session were \$710.19 per threecredit course (half course, seventeen days). International student tuition fees were \$2,141.94 per three-credit course. These fees (both domestic and international) are doubled for a six-credit course, and are expected to increase slightly for the 2016 Summer Session. Registration/tuition payment procedures will be forwarded upon receipt of the application and required documents. Payment for the travel/accommodation portion of the program is made to Sarracini Travel as outlined in the following 'Transportation and Accommodation' section.

A special flight rate has been arranged with departures on June11and June 28. Students may stay longer than the period stipulated above, but a return flight, leaving from Rome, Italy, must be confirmed at the time of the initial booking; it is expected that there will be a surcharge for students departing from Italy to return to Canada on dates other than those specified and published. No changes, under any circumstances can be made to the return flight booking once it has been arranged. Students will be responsible for their own accommodation arrangements and all costs if they choose to stay longer than the specific dates of their course (these arrangements can be made with Sarracini Travel).

A penalty of \$150.00 will be applied to any change to the date of travel after tickets have been issued.

To confirm a spot in the program, a deposit of \$500.00, payable to Sarracini Travel, is required as soon as possible but no later than March 14, 2016.
